



Hernan Justo was invited to become Artistic Director of Carolina Ballet Theatre by its founder Barbara Selvy in 2000. He has been involved in all aspects of the company: from teaching classes, coaching, teaching after school dance and outreach classes to creating original works. His repertoire for the company is from classical to contemporary. Choreographing full length ballets such as Hunchback of Notre Dame to his Award-winning choreography Pulling the Strings which toured internationally with the company. Hernan has also brought world renowned choreographers such as Alonzo King and Dwight Rhoden. His training came from the national ballet school of Buenos Aires, Argentina the Institution Superior de Arte Teatro Colón. He joined the

ballet Estable del Teatro Colón in 1982 and then Ballet del Teatro Argentino de la Plata two years later. In 1988, his career took him to the Ballet de Santiago, Chile. After three years, Hernan joined the Ballet Clásico de Cámara in Caracas, Venezuela, under the direction of Nina Novak, formerly prima ballerina of Les Ballet Russe de Monte Carlo. Hernan arrived in the United States as a principal dancer with the Charlotte Ballet in 1994 under the artistic direction of the late Salvatore Aiello and later, Jean Pierre Bonnefoux, Patricia McBride and Jerri Kumery all artists affiliated with New York City Ballet. He added to his repertoire several Balanchine masterpieces for which he was critically acclaimed by Dance Magazine and The New York Times. Hernan and his wife, Anita Pacylowski, co-direct and teach at DanceArts Greenville.



Anita Pacylowski-Justo is a native of Columbia, MD. Her formal ballet training came from the Washington School of Ballet in Washington, D.C. She is a Princess Grace Award in Dance, National Young Arts Level 1 winner, and received the Presidential Scholar in the Arts in Dance award by the White House Commission in the Arts. She also was a finalist at the New York International Ballet Competition, and semi-finalist at the Prix de Lausanne competition in Lausanne, Switzerland. She's been nominated for the coveted Benois de la Danse Award, "the Oscars" of the Ballet world. Her professional career started in The Washington Ballet under the direction of Mary Day, While there, her international touring was to Russia,

Thailand, Singapore, France, England and Spain. Highlights include performing the Grand Pas de Deux from The Nutcracker at the Kennedy Center for President Clinton and the First Lady, and performing at the White House Holiday Tea Party. She then moved to Charlotte Ballet as a principal dancer where she met her husband, Hernan Justo. After 7 years with that company she joined her husband as artistic leadership of CBT. She is also the co-artistic director of DanceArts Greenville and is currently on staff at the Fine Arts Center.



Erica Sturman is a native of Springfield, Illinois, where she began dancing at the age of 3 under direction of Grace Nanavatti. She joined the Springfield Ballet Company in 1999 under the direction of Julie Ratz and performed soloist roles in Snow Queen, The Nutcracker and Romeo and Juliet. In 2005, Erica moved to Greenville, SC to start her professional career with CBT. She has performed in many leading roles with CBT. Erica also had the privilege of working with Alonzo King's "Map" and Dwight Roden's "Beetlejuice". Erica has been a dance instructor at DAG since 2007.



Meghan Loman was born in Springfield, Illinois, Meghan has been dancing with CBT for over a decade. She began her training with Grace Luttrell Nanavati at Dance Arts Studio in Springfield and began performing with the Springfield Ballet Company under Julienne Ratz in 1999. In 2001, Meghan placed in the top ten of the Youth American Grand Prix Chicago Semi- Finals and went on to compete in the NYC Finals. Meghan has been privileged to work with some amazing choreographers such as; Dwight Rhoden, Adam Sage, Robert Philander Valentine, Mark Diamond, Marcus Herman Payne, Julie Tice, and Krenley Guzman. She has performed original works created by Martha Graham, Alivin Aley,

Dwight Rhoden, and Alonzo King. She has enjoyed sharing the stage with fellow dancers Herman and Erica Cornejo, Jeanette Delgado, Skylar Brandt and Daniel Ulbrich.



Martin Justo is from Caracas, Venezuela, and began dancing in 1999. He trained with Quinte Ballet School in Canada and School of Carolina Ballet Theatre. He has toured throughout Uruguay with CBT and has recently traveled and performed as a guest in Fujinomia, Japan, dancing pas de deux from Giselle, La Bayadere, and Swan Lake. Some of his signature roles are the charming young Nutcracker Prince in Hernan Justo's The Nutcracker, the Mad Scientist in Madeline Jazz's Super Heroes, and the male soloist in A Tango for Angelina. Martin performed works by renowned contemporary choreographers such as Dwight Rhoden's Beatle Juice, and Alonzo King's Map.



Kiera Morgan is in her third year with CBT. After graduating high school, she moved from Florida to Charlotte, NC where she began with Charlotte Ballet. Within her first year, she had opportunities to perform works by Patricia McBride, Mark Diamond and Lazlo Berdo. She performed with the second company doing Lecture Demonstrations. Her most remarkable memory was rehearsing and teaching choreography of "Scherzo" by Mark Diamond to the main company. In 2019, Kiera began with Richmond Ballet. She danced works including 'Theme and Variations' by George Balanchine, set by Jerri Kumery and Paul Boos. This past season she had the opportunity to perform 'The Waiting Room' by Salvatore Aiello set and staged by Jerri Kumery and Mia Cunningham.



Camilo Cardenas-Herrera began dancing at the age of ten Colombia, South America at the Colombian Institute for Classical Ballet. He obtained a dance degree from Ballet-Centered, secondary and higher-level institutions where he was educated by ballet masters Cloria Castro, Helena Cala, and Maria Helena llorente as well as the teacher from the National Ballet of Cuba. Upon graduation, he joined the Conservatorio de Valencia in Spain where he studied for two years. Camilo also received a full scholarship in 2012 with Miami City Ballet and in 2011 he participated in the International Festival of Valencia, Spain. Camilo has performed professionally with the National Ballet of Colombia, Atlantic City Ballet,

Montgomery Ballet and the Hinsdale Ballet Theatre in Chicago. Camilo was a principal dancer with Columbia City Ballet for 5 years, danced with Columbia Classical Ballet as well as Pensacola Ballet and now is excited to dance with CBT as a principal dancer.

Gabrielle Moore trained and performed with Carolina Ballet Theatre from 2005-2016. After which, she trained with Charlotte Ballet until 2019. This will be her fourth season with Carolina Ballet Theatre. Her hometown is Greenville, South Carolina; however, she previously danced with the Roanoke Ballet Theater in Virginia. Her favorite roles have been dancing Russian Girl in Serenade under the direction of Patricia McBride as well as the Arabian Coffee in Nutcracker.



Sofia Justo is a recent graduate of the University of South Carollina where she earned her degree in Dance Education. While in school and under the direction of Dr. Stephanie Millings, she was a member of the USC Dance Company. She has worked with dance masters such as Alonzo King, Dwight Rhoden and Laszlo Berdo. Her favorite show she performed with CBT was Snow White as and her favorite piece was Merceditas from Tangofusion by Hernan Justo.



Marja' Quaqua was born and raised in Greenville, SC with her journey in dance beginning at age 3. She has been successful at Youth America Grand Prix competitions ranking in the Top 3 in semi-finals granting her a chance to go to the finals. In April 2023, Marja' placed Top 12 in her YAGP trio. She has traveled along the east coast as a guest artist, more specifically for Ballet in The City (a non-profit organization). This is her first year as a professional with CBT.



Jordan Ann Shannon is a passionate dancer who trained at Armes with Rebecca Lee and Greenville Ballet for 8 years. In 2020, she joined DanceArts Greenville and now dances professionally with CBT. Influenced by Hernan and Anita, she excels both on stage and in a marketing degree at Greenville Tech. Additionally, she ventured into film with Debbie Allen and honed her skills at the Fine Arts Center under Gina Bunts. He later enrolled into the School of Richmond Ballet where he studied under Igor Antanov, Malcolm Burn, and more. After spending three years at the Richmond Ballet Mr. Penn was accepted as a trainee of the company whilst completing his senior year. After graduating, Brandon spent one year at the State University of New York (SUNY) at Purchase College Conservatory for Dance, studying under Larry Clark, Taryn Russell, and Ted Kivitt and others. After spending a year at SUNY, Penn

was offered a position with Atlanta Ballet 2. After two years there, Brandon was offered a company position with the Columbia City Ballet. Later, after much experience and repertory under his belt, Brandon accepted a principal contract with the Fort Wayne Ballet where he just finished his second season. Since, he has taken upon a freelance career and guested along the east coast and further. He would like to immensely thank his family for all of their love, support and words of wisdom.



Vaughn Newman is a professional dancer, choreographer, and founder of Vaughn Newman Dance, Greenville's first professional black dance company. VND opened its doors in 2018, curating black dance in Upstate SC. Vaughn began dancing at William Penn Arts Charter (Philadelphia, PA) and continued training at Freedom Theater, PHILADANCO, & New World School of the Arts, Miami, FL. While in Miami, he performed with Momentum Dance Company and Brazz Dance Theater before relocating to Upstate SC in 2009, where he partnered with local studios and theaters before creating VND. In January 2022, South Arts recognized Vaughn as one of the "Emerging Leaders of Color" because of his commitment to the

arts. This past August, he traveled to Chana, Africa, to train with the "WASSA Pan African Dance Company" for a month-long West African Dance and Drum tour. Entering its 5th Anniversary season, the VND organization continues its moving storytelling by fusing spirituality, life experiences, human encounters, spoken word, and thought-provoking dance for higher consciousness through the arts.


